

Request for Proposals: Instructional Technology Services' Innovative Pedagogy Grant Program

Overview

The Instructional Technology Services' (ITS) Innovative Pedagogy Grant Program is a unique program that offers Texas A&M University (TAMU) faculty and staff the opportunity to learn how to skillfully intertwine technology into a face-to-face, online, or hybrid course. The program is open to any/all TAMU faculty and staff who teach 100- or 200-level courses.

Available Resources

Fifteen awards of up to \$10,000 may be made to a Principal Investigator (PI). Please see program details for payout schedule. This program is only available to faculty and staff located at the Texas A&M University College Station campus and to faculty and staff members who are Instructor of Record for 100- and 200- level courses.

Proposal Requirements

Each proposal must contain the following:

- A cover page:
 - Name and title
 - Course name and number
 - College and department
 - Mailing address with mailstop
 - Phone number and email
 - Signature of supporting college dean
- Narrative
 - Identify course selected for redesign
 - Anticipated outcomes from participating
 - Planned date for teaching redesigned course
- Course Syllabus

Proposals must be submitted to Instructional Technology Services by Friday, December 2. All proposals may be sent via email to itshelp@tamu.edu.

Reporting Requirements

The PI must participate in an online eCampus community. This community will be used for continuous communication with ITS. The PI will be responsible for completing and submitting a Progress Report form (every two (2) months) and a Monthly Reflection regarding implementation of the redesigned course. The information gathered from the Progress Report will be compiled and submitted to the Program Coordinators (Jennifer Castillo and Jernaley Martin) and the PI's supporting dean on a bi-annual basis. The information provided in the Monthly Reflection will be used solely for private communication between the PI and a member of ITS.

Once the course has been implemented the PI will be responsible for reporting to ITS once a semester for one year. The report form will be emailed to all PIs accordingly. Please note, it is required that the course developed be taught a minimum of three (3) semesters.

Additionally, grant teams are encouraged to share their experiences by presenting at the 2018 or 2019 TAMU Teaching with Technology Conference.
